Anchor Academy School Code: 821342

The SAT Reasoning Test is a three-hour-and-45-minute test that measures critical reading, mathematical reasoning, and writing skills that students have developed over time and that they need to be successful in college. The new SAT is better aligned with current curriculum and institutional practices in high school and college. By including a third measure of skills, writing, the SAT reinforces the importance of writing throughout a student's education and will help colleges make better admissions and placement decisions. The new SAT was administered for the first time in March 2005 for the class of 2006.

The SAT Subject Tests (formerly SAT II: Subject Tests) are a battery of one-hour, mostly multiple-choice tests that measure how much students know about a particular academic subject and how well they can apply that knowledge.

IMPORTANT NOTES

1. Exam start and end times must be adhered to by all schools. However, if necessary, schools may begin an exam up to one hour before the scheduled start time to accommodate local schedule conflicts (e.g., bus schedules). Students must remain in the supervised exam room for a minimum of one hour after the original scheduled start time (e.g., begin exam at 12 noon but ensure students do not leave until after 2:00 p.m.).
2. With the addition of the Grade 10 and 11 exams, there are instances where more than one exam is scheduled in the same time-slot (e.g., English 10, French 12 and Communications 12 all at 9 a.m.). When this happens, allow the student to write the first exam, receive a suitable supervised break and then write the second exam.
3. In November, April, and May, all exams offered will be available electronically only, except: History 12 and Biology 12 in November and Chemistry 12 and Principals of Math 12 in April, which will be offered in paper only.
4. Students may write the same Grade 10 and 11 exam (e.g., SC 10) in only one of the November, April or August sessions in any one school year.
5. Translation of Grade 12 exams is determined in September of each year by request from the Conseil scolaire francophone.
6. In August, Grade 10, 11 and BC First Nations Studies 12 exams are offered through a student's school or district. Students should check with their school prior to the end of the school year to determine exam registration procedures for their school or district.
7. The Ministry of Education aims to ensure this exam schedule does not change. Occasionally circumstances require changes to the exam schedule after it is initially published. Should changes to the exam schedule be required, the Ministry of Education will communicate these changes via email through TRAX Updates and the Graduation List Serve. Changes will also be posted to the Ministry of Education's Provincial Examinations website.

The Ministry of Education provides a 'Student Secure Web' page where you may log on to and access the results of provincial exams you have written. Simply follow these steps:

1. First call *Anchor Academy* to get your Personal Education Number (PEN).

3. On the top of this page find icon 'Student Secure Web' and click on it.
4. A page will appear saying 'Welcome to Student Secure Web' - click on enter.

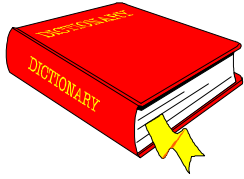

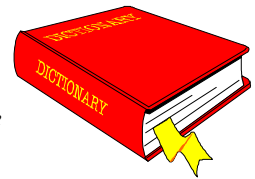

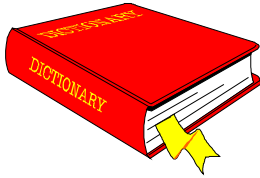
GLOSSARY



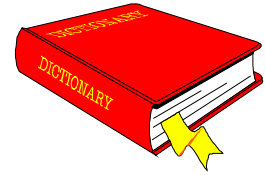
Bracketed numbers following definitions refer to Handbook pages where more information can be found.

- Academic Projection** - clear lay out of courses needed for high school graduation - **International Program (D-11)**
- Anchor Log** - monthly newsletter from *Anchor Academy*. Kids Page, info., events, contests.
- Bursaries** - money provided by *Anchor Academy* to assist students with the costs of International Student Convention, short term missions, and/or post secondary training. **(B-5, G-4, F-4 to F-5)**
- C.A.T.** - (Canadian Achievement Test) - usually written once a year. **(A-15)**
- C.C.A.** - (Course Credit Allocation) - This is the BC grant money that *Anchor Academy* provides to the parents of each enrolled **Distributed Learning** student. **(A-14)**
- Checkup** - found in PACEs. Sections of miniature testing.
- Course Choice Form (CCF)** - a listing of courses and assignments for the current school year. **(I-9 to I-15)**
- College Preparatory Program** - academic program leading to graduation- **International Program. (D-18)**
- DL** - Distributed Learning, a BC Ministry of Education funded program for at-home learners. **(H-1 to H-28)**
- Diagnostic Test(s)** - English - Math - Social Studies / Science - Word Building (Spelling) - French. These tests will expose any gaps in the learning process. Return them to *Anchor Academy* for scoring. **(D-5)**
- Enrolment** - benefits include record keeping, tutoring etc. **(E-3-International Program & I-3 -DL Program)**
- Etymology** - the study dealing with the origin and history of words. Word Building 97 - 108 course.
- Forms** - enrolment - student record release - parental consent - Scripture memory - parent training , etc.**(E-1 International Prog. & I-1 - DL Prog.)**
- F.S.A.** - Foundation Skills Assessment, an annual province - wide test expected to be written by all **DL** students in grades 4 and 7.
- Gaps** - PACEs that need to be completed before student can start on grade level PACEs, indicated from the diagnostic testing.
- G.E.** - Grade Equivalency, most commonly referred to score on the Canadian Achievement Test, and reported on the Student Transcript.
- General Program** - designed to prepare a student for the business world - **International Program. (D-19)**
- Honour Roll** - qualify four times a year for this certificate. **(B-6)**
- Honours Program** - a challenging graduation program that prepares the student for top post-secondary training - **International Program. (D-17)**
- International Student** - a school aged child enrolled in the BC education system who is temporarily living in British Columbia, but whose parents are not Canadian citizens nor have landed immigrant status in Canada.
- IRP** - integrated resource package.
- ISC** - International Student Convention, an annual event held in a large U.S. university to which *Anchor Academy* teens are invited to compete against several thousand other young people in over 130 events.**(F-2 & F-3)**
- Labs** - videos and DVDs available for science labs. Students going on to college / university need to do these. **(D-22)**
- Library** - borrow for a small fee, and return for refundable deposit; reading kits, videos, score keys, tapes, literature books. **(D-22 & D-23)**
- Linear course** - a ten month course.
- Maintenance** - monthly or annual charge for **International Program** enrolled student services.

GLOSSARY

M.O.E. - Ministry of Education.

Offshore student - a school aged child enrolled in the BC education system who resides outside of Canada.

PACE - Package of *Accelerated Christian Education* student text/workbook.

PACE Test - found in centre of PACE. Pull PACE Test out of PACE and securely file. Student writes the PACE Test day after handing in finished PACE. **(D-5, H-23)**

P.E.N. - Personal Education Number, a unique 9 digit number issued by the BC Ministry of Education for each BC student.

PLO - prescribed learning outcome.

PO # - purchase order number.

Portfolio - For **DL Programs** (grades 10, 11, 12). Instructions provided in Planning 10 course. This is a required 4 credit "course" of the BC Dogwood Diploma program **(H-6)**. Not to be confused with "Portfolio Submissions" as required from all students enrolled in *Anchor Academy's* Individualized Program. **(H-8)**

Portfolio Submissions - to include ALL items required by DL teacher (work done by your child that establishes PLO's are being met). **(H-8)**

P.R.I.F. - **PROGRESS REPORT INFORMATION FORM** of desirable traits and habits, Scripture memory and Readmaster to be filled out by the student and supervising parent at the end of each quarter and mailed in with the PACE Tests and P.E. form.

PSI - Post secondary institution.

Ready, Set, Learn - a British Columbia early childhood education event for 3 and 4 year old children.

Record Keeping - file set-up, records from previous schools, report cards, academic projections, diploma, transcript.

Refundable Deposit - when you return any borrowed school items, you will receive that deposit back (credit to account).

Registration - legal requirement for BC home schooling children. *Anchor Academy* accepts registrations from anywhere in B.C. You receive a monetary benefit plus more. **(C-2 to C-4)**

S.A.T. - (Scholastic Aptitude Test) used to assist colleges and universities in their selection of students. **(J-3)**

Score Key - answers for marking PACEs.

Semester course - a five month course.

Star Chart - chart to hang up on student's wall. Progress is indicated by placing stars on the chart. Average student has 15 stars per quarter.

Student Resource Folder - Contains maps, charts, forms each student will use throughout the school year and other useful information. (received at the time of enrolment).

T.A. - Teacher's Aide.

Test Key - answers for PACE Test. The Test Key is found inside the Score Key. Place Test Key in secure place. Parent uses it to score test.

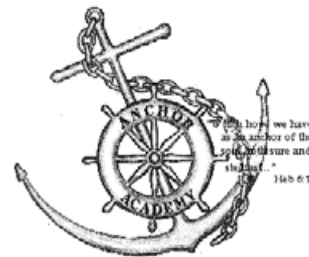
T.C.A. - (TEXTBOOK CREDIT ALLOCATION) This is the BC grant money every BC **registered home schooler** student can receive through *Anchor Academy* toward the purchase of educational services and supplies. **(C-2)**.

Transcript - a document detailing the student's high school courses and grades as well as S.A.T. and C.A.T. results. Required for admissions to college / university.

Vocational Program - one of five **International** graduation programs. **(D-19)**

YouthSEND - *Anchor Academy's* short term mission division. **(G-3)**
